JOB DESCRIPTION

Title: Pianist/ORGANIST FOR 11:00 AM WORSHIP SERVICE

Reporting Relationships: Responsible to the FCC Pastor, FCC Personnel Committee and FCC Council.

Qualifications: Proficient in playing piano and other keyboard instruments (preference given to proficiency playing a three-manual pipe organ); experienced in performing unaccompanied and as an accompanist with vocal or instrumental soloists or groups; competent in sight reading.

Working Relationships: Develop and maintain a positive working relationship with FCC staff and members necessary to carry out the total ministry of the church.

Essential Job Functions:

1. Provides musical support for the FCC 11:00 AM worship service including prelude, hymns, reflections/offertory, and postlude.
2. Records hymns for 8:30 AM worship service.
3. Accompanies Chancel Choir during Wednesday rehearsals and Sunday worship.
4. Provides musical support for the FCC special services (i.e. Easter, Maundy Thursday, Christmas Eve).
5. Provides musical support for special music with the bell choir(s), vocalists, or instrumentalists, as available.
6. Provides musical support for weddings, funerals, etc., as arranged by and with individual parties at the discretion of the organist/pianist. Compensation to be provided by the individual parties.
7. Reports any maintenance or repair needed on the instruments played to the Pastor.
8. Demonstrates a good working knowledge of sacred music choral repertoire.

Physical Factors: Be able to perform under stress when confronted with emergency, critical, or unusual situations.

Standards of Performance: The Pianist/Organist will be evaluated annually.
