The Prayer Bowl explained...

My prayer bowl has a bit of a story. I take a glass mosaic class on Monday nights, and it allows me to hang out with a couple of like-

minded friends. That's so important these days. We weathered the pandemic together... sometimes even making art over Zoom. Once we felt it was safe, we would get together in person, and made mosaics, socially distanced and in masks for quite a while.

I now have a bunch of glass mosaics hanging around my house. I was telling mom (Sandra Brown...for those who maybe don't know me) that I was running out of room for mosaics and out of money for classes and so she commissioned me to make a prayer bowl for the church. She wanted something that would complement the mosaic in the chapel, and I went to work!

The bowl is one of those old punch bowls you find at rummage sales...probably from the 70's. I sketched a bit, but it's hard to sketch on a 2D surface something that will eventually be round like the bowl. I added those images I loved the most from the mosaic in the chapel...the rainbow, the birds, the mountains.

During each Monday class I would turn the bowl over on its side, prop it up so it wouldn't roll around, and pick the part of the design that seemed the least intimidating. I would start cutting glass and gluing it. I slowly worked my way around the bowl, week by week, until every part of it was covered with color.

At that point it is time for the grout. For contrast I chose a gray and mixed it until it was the consistency of peanut butter. Then you start spreading it and pushing it between the pieces of glass. You scrape it a bit, let it dry a bit, and then buff the rest of the grout off...just like you would with a tile floor. And then you spend several hours scraping off all of the excess glue. Ask mom, this step makes a huge difference!

Finally, we looked for the perfect place for the bowl...somewhere where the light would shine through all of the beautiful colors! I just love where the bowl found its home. I hope you all do too.
