SUNDAY, MARCH 20 SERVICE INFORMATION "Unless you repent, you will all perish as they did." Luke 13:1-9 Sanctuary Service @ 8:30 a.m. GREAT DAY OF SERVICE! 10 AM – 2 PM PIZZA PARTY @2 PM As we approach the celebration of Easter, we must first pass through the days of reflection during the season of Lent. This series of images bring the story of the final days of Jesus to the forefront of our meditations as we ponder the

intersection of the ministry of Christ and our own experiences.

Luke 12:27 Consider the lilies, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin; yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like



one of these. In the overall arc of Luke's gospel message, this verse is far from the resurrection story, yet the lily is a symbol of life. Life which is beautiful and delicate, yet resilient. The flowers of the Palestinian hills bloom each spring, bringing vibrant colors to the landscape. Barren patches are transformed into blankets of vitality. It is an annual resurrection of beautiful life.

Jesus uses the imagery of creation to assure the disciples that God's abundance has a way of sustaining life through the ongoing cycles of nature. The ebb and flow of life does include death, as illustrated by the grass of the field that in time becomes fuel for the oven. But when alive, in its verdant state, it is beautiful.

This teaching is also a warning not to be overly concerned with adorning yourself with the finest of clothing or obsessing over culinary delicacies. Creative souls have added their artistic touch to augment the experience of life through their gifts to the world. But pursuing the finer things of life to excess may distract us from the beauty of life lived more simply in relationship with our families, communities, and with God's creation. The natural world around us displays wonders beyond anything produced by the hands of humanity.

God's love is poured out over all of creation. Lilies of the field, birds of the air, and God's human children are all precious. Trust in God's goodness and be grateful in this time of rebirth that we are able to experience the beauty of the earth. -Pastor Stephen
